Dear PACIM Members!

Witam Wszystkich Serdecznie!



Over the past few weeks, many members of the Polonia community have been busy preparing for the visit of Dr. Paweł Zyzak, the Polish Consul General in Chicago. He will arrive in Minnesota on November 10 and stay with us until November 13. The consul's schedule is filled with meaningful engagements. On Saturday, he will visit the Polish Saturday School, participate in the Independence Day Run, and deliver a speech at the Armistice Day Celebration. The following day, he will visit the Sacred Heart of Jesus Church, Holy Cross Church, and the office of PACIM. On Monday, the consul has planned to meet with Polish academics from the University of Minnesota and St. Thomas University. While there, he will also have the opportunity to attend the exhibition prepared by the Minnesota Polish Medical Society. His visit will culminate on Tuesday with a meeting with medical professionals at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester and a tour of the Polish Museum in Winona. This summer, a significant Polish American event occurred - the dedication ceremony of fifty-nine new grave markers commemorating the Polish "Blue Army" at the Holy Sepulcher Cemetery in Detroit on June 17th. The granite crosses were placed in memory of the Polish American volunteers who served in the "Blue Army," a World War I military unit composed of ethnic Poles and Polish immigrants who fought on the Western Front and later in the Polish-Soviet War.

The project was co-financed by the National Remembrance Institute (IPN) and the Consulate General of the Republic of Poland in Chicago. During the event I had a chance to talk to Adam Siwek, the IPN's Director of the Office for Commemorating the Struggle and Martyrdom. He expressed his support for the WWII Warsaw US Airlift Memorial project, a cooperation between PACIM and Sister Cities Columbia Heights-Łomianki, Poland. 

1944 Warsaw **US** Airlift **Memorial**

In September 1944, during the Warsaw Uprising, Allied planes dropped supplies to help the fighters in Warsaw. On September 18, the American B17G Fortress "See you later" was shot down over Dziekanów Leśny, eight miles away from the capital. Eight crew members died in the crash; two survived but were captured and taken as prisoners. After the war, both of the survivors returned to the USA. One of the heroic pilots who lost his life that day, Walter Shimshock (Władysław Szymczak), was a Polish American from Columbia Heights, Minnesota.



In 1987, the American Pilots Monument was unveiled at the Łomianki war cemetery. When US Vice-President George H.W. Bush visited Poland, he paid his respect by laying flowers in honor of the downed American pilots.








In 1989, when the families of fallen pilots visited Łomianki, the idea of establishing cooperation between two cities, Łomianki, Poland and Columbia Heights, Minnesota, arose.

The ardent supporters of this idea were Walter's brothers - Bernard and George Szymczak. On their initiative, on July 14, 1991, the two cities formalized their partnership with a cooperation agreement.

Since the partnership began, Sister Cities Columbia Heights members have visited Łomianki multiple times to take part in commemorative events for the crash anniversary. A significant highlight was on September 16, 2022, when the Mayor Amada Simula of Columbia Heights was present for unveiling of a monument dedicated to the Heroic Crew of the B-17G Airplane. Amada and other Sister Cities members engaged in many historical activities organized by the city for children and entire families.

In 2023, during one of the Sister Cities meetings held in Columbia Heights City Hall, the conversation between Mayor Amada Simula and PACIM President Edyta Dudek led to initiating the efforts to erect a sister monument in Łomianki Park in Columbia Heights, as a tribute to the American airmen who tragically lost their lives in the 1944 plane crash, as well as the Polish soldiers and civilians who resisted the Germans during the Warsaw Uprising. On October 24, 2023, the city of Łomianki graciously granted PACIM and Sister Cities Columbia Heights the authorization to replicate their monument design in Minnesota.

The Columbia Heights Sister City Organization has been very active in Columbia Heights for the past 33 years. Our sister city is Lomianki, Poland. It has a history that reflects back to WWII and the original founders. We are a volunteer organization. Anything that has accomplished over the years is due to the amazing members. We meet the second Tuesday of each month, except July and December. Our membership dues are very low, but any money we receive goes to support many Columbia Heights events, charitable organizations, and any costs of the organization. Our big project has been supplying books, magazines, calendars to the English teachers in Lomianki, Poland. We call it "The English Learners Library". All are welcomed to join and be a part of this International Organization.

News from Poland

Parliamentary Elections

In the Polish parliamentary elections held on October 15, 2023, the conservative Law and Justice (PiS) party lost seats in the lower chamber (Sejm) from 235 to 194, while the main opposition, led by the Civic Coalition (KO), increased its seat count from 134 to 157. Another notable gain was made by the Third Way alliance, which increased its seat count from 30 to 65. The opposition electoral alliance Senate Pact 2023 won a plurality of the vote and a majority of seats in the Senate. The opposition parties are expected to form a coalition government. Voter turnout was 74.4%, a significant rise from previous elections.

While globally, the Law and Justice party garnered 35.38% and 43.24% of votes for the Sejm and Senate, respectively, in Minnesota, the support for the party was markedly lower, with 25.45% of votes for the Sejm and 31.30% for the Senate. Conversely, most Polish voters in Minnesota cast their ballots in favor of opposition parties.

PiS - Law and Justice


KO - Civic Coalition


